INTERNATIONAL

1) Ecuador declares state of emergency over crime wave

Ecuador's President Guillermo Lasso has declared a 60-day state of emergency in the South American country, due to the rise in violent drug crimes. President Lasso has pointed to drug trafficking and consumption as the main drivers behind an increase in murders, home burglary, thefts of vehicles and goods, and muggings.

2) 2021 Production Gap Report

The 2021 Production Gap Report was released by the leading research institutes and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP). The Production Gap Report, first launched in 2019, tracks the discrepancy between governments' planned fossil fuel production and global production levels consistent with limiting warming to 1.5°C or 2°C.

NATIONAL

1) "Future Tech 2021"

The Confederation of Indian Industry has organised an International Conference and Exhibition on Digital technologies, "Future Tech 2021- a Journey of digital transformation to technology adoption and acceleration" from October 19 to 27, 2021. The focus theme of the International conference is "Driving technologies for building the future, we all can trust".

2) Mount Harriet

The Union government has renamed Mount Harriet of Andaman and Nicobar Islands to Mount Manipur. Mount Harriet, the third-highest island peak in A&N Islands, where Manipur's Maharaja Kulchandra Singh and 22 other freedom fighters were imprisoned during the Anglo-Manipuri war (1891).

BUSINESS AND ECONOMY

1) NPCI Tokenization

The National Payments Corporation of India has launched the NPCI Tokenization system to further enhance the safety of customers and provide a seamless shopping experience to consumers. The NPCI Tokenization System (NTS) will support the tokenisation of RuPay cards, to provide an alternate for storing card details with merchants.

GEOGRAPHY AND ENVIRONMENT

1) Georissa mawsmaiensis

A micro snail species named Georissa mawsmaiensis has been discovered in Mawsmai Cave in Meghalaya. The new species is unique from Georissa sarrita (a member of the same genus discovered in 1851) in its shell morphology. The members of the Georissa genus are widely distributed across and reported from Africa, Asia, and the Pacific.
