## 2) Ecowrap

As per the report of State Bank of India's economic research team Ecowrap, India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth in FY22 was estimated to be revised to around 9.5 percent. The first advance estimate of GDP growth by the National Statistical Office (NSO) has stated India's FY22 GDP growth at 9.2 percent.
